

ORDINANCE 2010-02

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MANLY, IOWA, 1998, BY ADDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO CHAPTER 69 , PARKING REGULATIONS

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Manly, Iowa:

SECTION 1. NEW SUB-SECTION. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Manly, Iowa is amended by adding a new sub-section in Chapter 69, numbered 69.10.01, entitled SNOW REMOVAL, which is hereby adopted to read as follows:

69.10.01 SNOW REMOVAL. For the purposes of facilitating the removal of snow from the streets and making it possible to keep the streets open and free from obstructions, the following limitations and restrictions are imposed from November 15 each year to March 31 of the following year. It shall be unlawful for any person to park, abandon, or leave unattended any vehicle on any street in violation of the following provisions:

1. On even numbered days, parking is allowed on the even numbered side of the street. This applies to East Elmore between Todd and Broadway and East Main between Todd and Broadway. All vehicles must be moved by 7:00 P.M. the night before the required restriction goes into effect. Example: By 7:00 P.M. on an even numbered day, you must move your vehicle to the odd side of the street to be in compliance for the next day.
2. On odd numbered days, parking is allowed on the odd numbered side of the street. This applies to East Elmore between Todd and Broadway and East Main between Todd and Broadway. All vehicles must be moved by 7:00 P.M. the night before the required restriction goes into effect. Example: By 7:00 P.M. on an odd numbered day, you must move your vehicle to the even side of the street to be in compliance for the next day.
3. The changeover period shall be between the hours of four o'clock (4:00) P.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) P.M. of each day.
4. Any vehicle parked or otherwise left unattended in violation of the provisions of this ordinance is declared to be a nuisance per se and shall be subject to a City imposed fine and removal by the City by means of towing or otherwise. Any removal and resulting storage of such a vehicle shall be at the expense of the owner or operator.

- A. A notice of fine for alternate side parking violation shall be issued against the registered owner of said vehicle. It shall be a misdemeanor for any person to permit or allow a motor vehicle to be parked in violation of the provisions of this code. The penalty for each violation shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00) made payable to the City of Manly.
- 5. Any police officer of the City of Manly police department, including any authorized volunteer officers, or a designee of the City shall be authorized to cause the towing of vehicles in violation of this code.
- 6. Alternate side parking shall be in effect from November 15 through March 31 of each year. Alternate side parking may be suspended or terminated by the City through a public announcement.
- 7. The City may, by declaration of a snow emergency by the Mayor, extend the term of alternate side parking through public announcement. Such public announcement shall constitute notice to the general public and all the provisions of this article shall be in effect until terminated by public announcement.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance area hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
